- 2.3. [randomized] She would look within to find what resonates with her the most while listening for whispers of dissent.

3. K'anissa:

- 3.1. [randomized] A fine answer. It is foolish not to trust those whom we are supposed to have faith in.
- 3.2. [randomized] [Ta'agra: alija = gods] Indeed. Khajiit have always looked to our communities, our alija, and even ourselves. We listen before we make decisions, as you know well.
- 3.3. [randomized] That is a much better answer than when this one asked you a few months ago, Fazhil. Very good.

- 3.1. [randomized] This one sees. Thank you for your insight and guidance.
- 3.2. [randomized] This one thought as much. Thank you for confirming.
- 3.3. [randomized] (grunt) Regardless, there is still some work before this one can be truly confident.

2. **M'zargo:**
- 2.1. [randomized] A rich accusation from a Rimmenese. M'zargo wonders if you still have some loyalty to your homeland.
- 2.2. [randomized] Unless you have proof, go back to your patrol. You spread fear for no reason except to undermine Millin.
- 2.3. [randomized] This one has no time to listen to you berate him. Leave him alone, Rim-Man.
3. **Serverus:**
- 3.1. [randomized] I'm keeping my eye on you, M'zargo. For your sake, make sure there's nothing for it to see.
- 3.2. [randomized] You might have lived here for a while, but you're not a Sabosiss. If push comes to shove, the clanmother won't protect you. Remember that.
- 3.3. [randomized] The clan mother may not see through you, but I do. One wrong move, and you're gone.

2. Ja'khar:

- 2.3. [randomized] [Ta'agra: ja'khajiit = kitten, child] Uh, isn't it good that this one is learning? He thought that was what ja'khajiit were supposed to do.

3. Hushara:

- 3.1. [randomized] It ends now, Ja'khar. This one does not want to tell you a second time.
- 3.2. [randomized] Unless you want more chores around the farm, you'll do what this one says. Understand?
- 3.3. [randomized] Just be less demanding about it. Do not embarrass this one in front of the rest of the clan.

2. Kesani:

- 2.2. [randomized] Fish keep people fuller for longer than plants do. Healthier, too - everyone needs fish in their diet.

- 2.3. [randomized] Every town has grain. This one's fishing gives Millin something few places in Ne Quin-al have. Other towns would kill for fish.

3. Izhal:

- 3.1. [randomized] Perhaps you should look into fish farming. This one has heard it brings greater yields for less work. Marry our fields, yes?
- 3.2. [randomized] Kesani, let's continue this argument at the next meal, yes? For this one, we will count who eats what.
- 3.3. [randomized] (laugh) Do you think Ja'khar and Ma'kina will have this same argument when they are adults and we are dead?

- 2.3. [randomized] Others are better with strangers than this one is. Ja'khar, especially. It is better that they do the talking.

3. Zadera:

- 3.1. [randomized] That is not a healthy way to live, Hushara. This one hopes you become more accepting one day.
- 3.2. [randomized] It is your business. This one will say no more.
- 3.3. [randomized] This one sometimes feels that way, but she still tries to be kind, and it costs her nothing. Think about that.
